for the

GOOD RULE AND GOVERNMENT

of the Borough of Lydd and for the prevention of nuisances, made by the Council of the Borough of Lydd in pursuance of Section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933.

CYCLING IN LYDD CHURCHYARD

In so far as the Council may indicate by notices conspicuously exhibited alongside any of the footpaths described in the Schedule to this Byelaw that the riding of bicycles, tricycles or other similar machines on such footpath is prohibited, no person shall ride any such bicycle, tricycle or other similar machine upon such footpath.

Provided that this Byelaw shall not apply to any person riding a bicycle, tricycle or other similar machine, otherwise than to the obstruction or danger of any person lawfully using such footpath, if the person so riding has lawful authority so to do.

Any person offending against this Byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction for each and every offence to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

Description of footpaths referred to in this Byelaw

The whole of the footpaths in the Churchyard surrounding All Saints' Parish Church,
Lydd, Kent
