

BOROUGH OF LYDD

BYELAW

for the

Good Rule and Government

of the Borough of Lydd and for the prevention and suppression of nuisances, made by the Council of the Borough of Lydd at a meeting thereof held on the sixth day of November, 1961, in pursuance of Section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933.

(1) **INDECENT LANGUAGE, &c.**

No person shall in any street or public place, or in any place within view or hearing of any street or public place, use any indecent language or gesture, or commit or solicit, incite or provoke any other person to commit any indecent act to the annoyance of residents or passengers.

(2) **FIGHTING**

No person shall in any street or public place fight or provoke or incite any person or animal to fight.

(3) **NUISANCES CONTRARY TO PUBLIC DECENCY**

No person shall in any street or public place to the annoyance of residents or passengers commit any nuisance contrary to public decency or propriety.

(4) **WILFUL JOSTLING**

If two or more persons assembled together wilfully obstruct the free use of any street, or wilfully jostle or annoy any foot passengers, and continue such obstruction, jostling, or annoyance after being required by a constable to desist, each such person shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to the penalty hereinafter provided.

(5) **SPITTING**

No person shall spit on the floor, side, or wall of any public carriage or of any public hall, public waiting-room or place of public entertainment, whether admission thereto be obtained upon payment or not.

(6) **NOISY ANIMALS**

No person shall keep within any house, building, or premises any noisy animal which shall be or cause a serious nuisance to residents in the neighbourhood. Provided that no proceedings shall be taken against any person for an offence against this byelaw unless the nuisance be continued after the expiration of a fortnight from the date of the service on such person of a notice alleging a nuisance, signed by not less than three householders residing within hearing of the animal.

PENALTY

Any person offending against any of the foregoing byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding FIVE POUNDS.

EXTENT

The foregoing byelaws shall extend and apply to the Borough of Lydd.

REVOCATION

The byelaw with regard to obscene language, etc. made by the Council on the 7th February, 1921, and the byelaws with regard to (1) deposit of litter, etc., and (2) deposit of dangerous substances, made by the Council on the 1st September, 1930, in pursuance of Section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, are hereby revoked.
