To whom it may concern.

I email you with my continued concern over the proposed permanent closing of the road on Princes Parade and diversion to its new location alongside The Royal Military canal which is an Historic and National Monument in its self.

My concerns are:

- No access to the beach on Princes Parade for anyone, walkers, swimmers, fisherman, and dog walker's people generally enjoying their human rights to what is currently a beautiful and much enjoyed location for public use and against our rights as tax payers.
- Destruction of wildlife natural habit where the road is to be re located which is currently a quiet area for wildlife to enjoy their existence, if the current road is to be moved there where will the naturel habit be for them with 150 houses and a leisure centre in front of them.
- Increased amount of light pollution from the road against the Royal Military Canal again not good for wildlife to exist.
- Noise pollution being closer to the canal which will also disrupt wildlife and nesting birds next to and on the canal including Swans.
- Increased traffic flow diverted to Seabrook road which is already very busy with plans for many more blocks of flats on the agenda for Seabrook Road in the near future which with Princes Parade traffic would be a nightmare also causing increased pollution to local residents on Seabrook Road.
- Concerns for extra traffic outside the Seabrook Primary School in terms of air pollution and danger to children crossing road.
- The proposed new location of the road would also cause extra noise and light pollution close to the homes of people living on the seaward side of the canal destroying their peaceful way of life.
- Emergency vehicle access along Princes Parade it appears there will not be any.

I do not see why if this development goes ahead why the existing road on Princes Parade cannot be used if would save not only so much disruption to all kinds of life but also money.
