To whom it may concern.

I originally objected to the proposal of the development of land at Princes Parade and the moving of the highway on 31/10/2017 and now I wish to ensure that my objection still stands for opposing to the diverting of the existing road away from the seafront and along the canal. (Stopping up)

The Princes Parade development can be served from this road and therefore it is not necessary or justified for it to be stopped and realigned for this development.

I see no reason to move this road. I personally feel that it would be so detrimental to the area for example the tranquility of the ironic military canal with its abundance of bird and wildlife, let alone the human element, walkers, fishermen, canoeist, etc. By moving this road it would have a wider impact creating unnecessary pollution and noise.
