I wish most strongly, to REAFFIRM my original objection, to the ludicrous stopping up of Princes Parade. Submitted in 2018

On the grounds of the environmental impact of moving the road next to a beautiful scheduled monument, essentially taking away the south bank and polluting with fumes and noise anyone using the canal as a tranquil refuge, for physical and mental wellbeing. Not to mention the canal wildlife, being within feet of a main road and the disturbance it would course.

Being so close and at height, the possibility of cars ending up actually in the canal, is of real concern.
