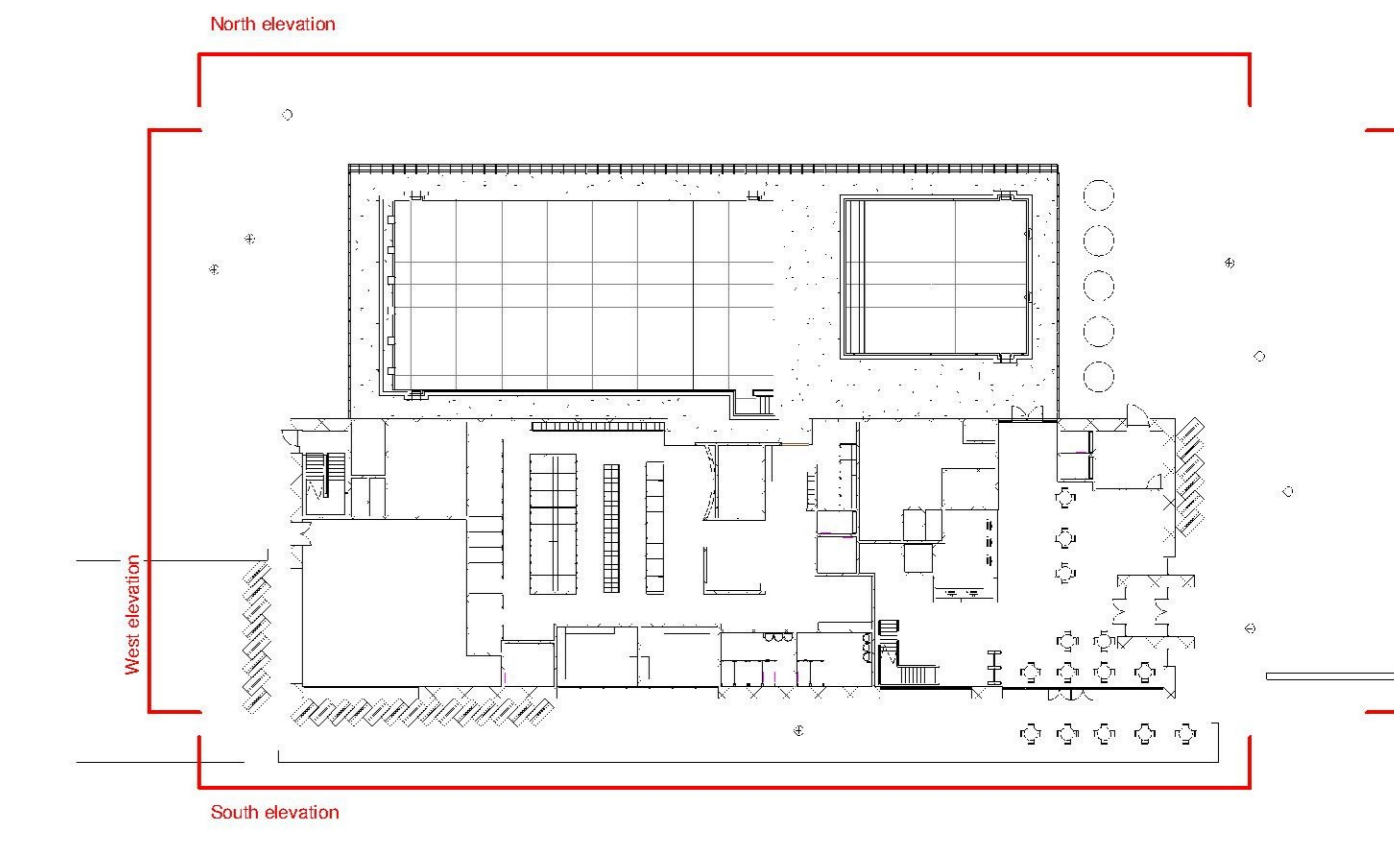
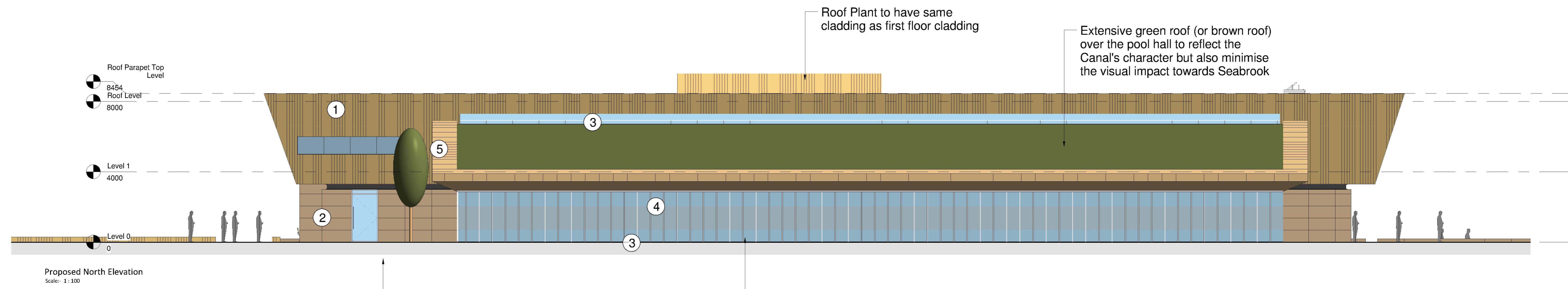


Metal plate to act as a shadow gap and divide between ground floor 'plinth' and first floor platform



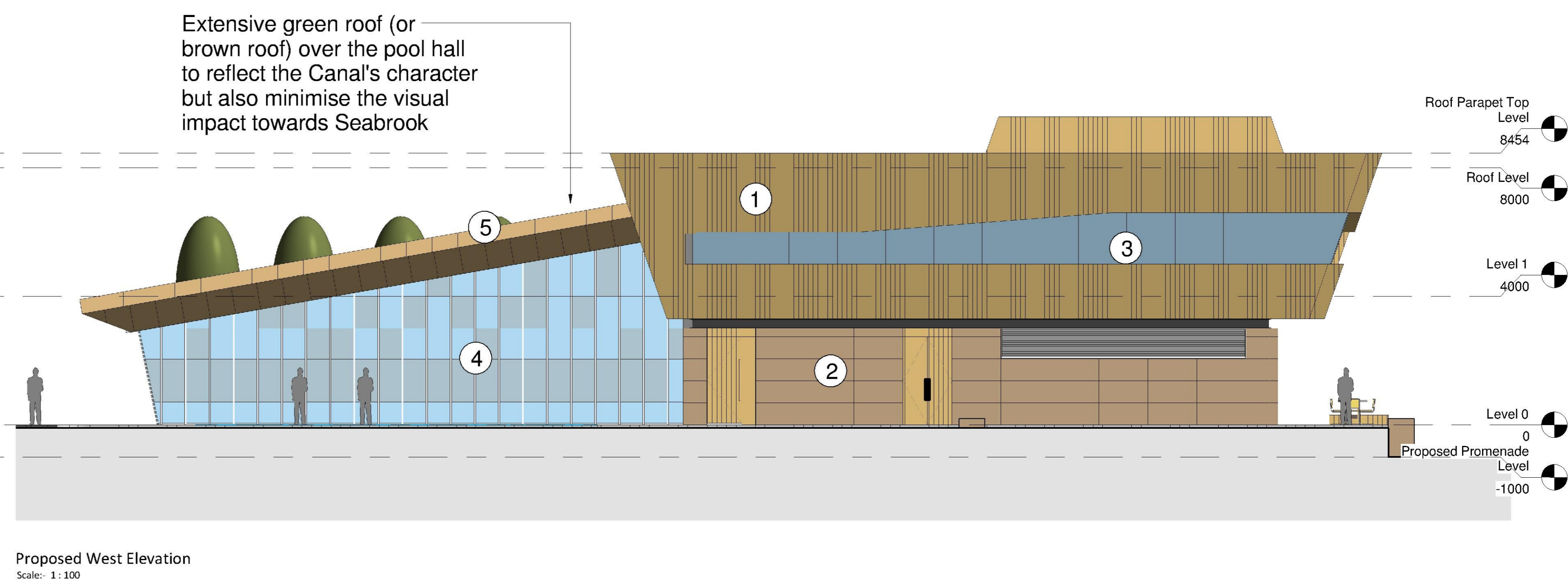
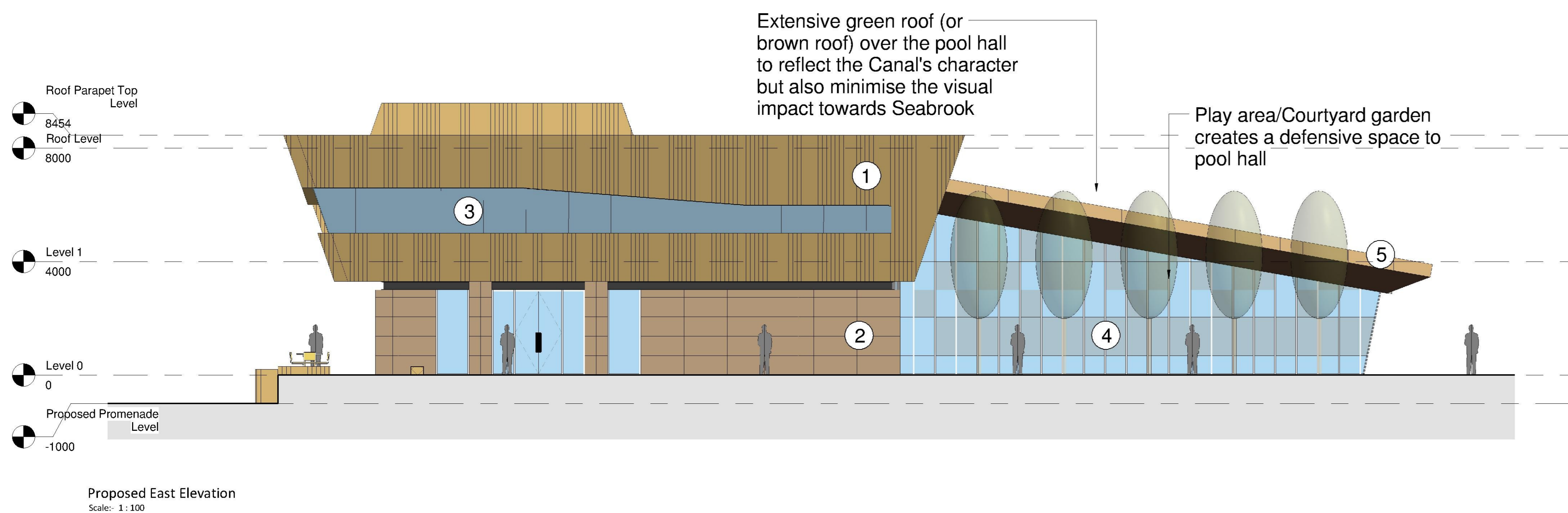
- Key to Materials

  - 2 Stone-filled gabion walls
  - 3 Clear Glazing
  - 4 Polycarbonate glass (mix of opaque & translucent panels)
  - 5 Anodised aluminium (colour bronze or similar)

A mix of opaque & translucent panels allow filtered natural light in the pool hall while preserving privacy for the users. The bottom strip of clear glazing allows for long views towards the hills while people are swimming
