Deliver appropriate police interventions which reduce crime and disorder

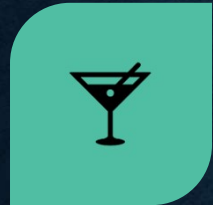

- Attend Licensing Committee hearings and Magistrates' Court as the police advocate

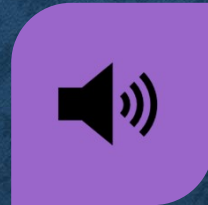
