The Coastal Crime campaign aims to highlight the warning signs to look out for when it comes to coastal crime and how to stop the criminals behind it. The Coastal Crime Line allows people to report any information or suspicions 100% anonymously.

What is coastal crime?

Essentially, it's any crime that has an impact on, or happens around, our coasts and borders, including smaller ports, docks, and marinas. From theft, to smuggling, to criminal damage, whether you're a keen sailor, work in the maritime industry or are simply enjoying a coastal hike, if you see something suspicious, the Coastal Crime Line is here for you.

What sort of warning signs should you be looking out for?

Some of the signs include:

 Seeing boats moored up in strange places or at strange times.




Information Awareness

Microchipping for cats is now compulsory

On 10 June 2024, it became law in England mandating the microchipping of all pet cats meaning all cats over the age of 20 weeks must be microchipped.

You can be fined up to £500 if your dog or cat is not microchipped. <u>DogorCatmicrochipped</u> on the Gov.uk website.

The organisation has grown in the UK and Republic of Ireland into a network of over 700 self-help groups and continues to attract new members every day of the week.

Al-Anon is available free of charge to anyone who is or has been affected by someone else's drinking, including adult children of alcoholics, parents, partners, spouses other relative including friends of alcoholics.

A simple scan can tell you if you have an abdominal aortic aneurysm. This is an enlargement of the main blood vessel in the abdomen and if left untreated it can be fatal.

Men aged 65+ are most at risk. NHS screening invitations will be sent to men aged 65 this year and those over 65 can request a scan.

Fraud / Scams

Doorstep Scams

Community Safety have noticed an increase in individuals knocking on people's doors about work on the property or gardening services for payment.

This is known as a doorstep scam when a person knocks on the door and tries to scam the householder seeking money for jobs or gain access to the property. Rogue traders may call round saying they have noticed something needs fixing on the property and can do this for a fee. Usually, they may start the job but is left unfinished and the work not carried out correctly.

Please remind family and friends about cold callers and not to be tempted to let anyone who turns up unannounced at the front door seeking to work at the property.

Report a scam or a problem with a tradesperson or product to TradingStandards/

<u>Action Fraud</u>: If you suspect that you've been scammed, report it to Action Fraud either over the phone or via their website.

<u>Citizens Advice</u>: contact them if you've been scammed on your doorstep and they'll pass your report onto Trading Standards.

You can also speak to your local KCC Warden who will try and help you whatever the issue and they can be found <u>KCCLocalCommunityWardens</u>

The <u>NeighbourhoodWatch</u> website provides useful information in spotting doorstep scammers including protecting yourself against these scammers.

TO STOP FRAUD

A Kent resident in relation to a fake email they received impersonating Sainsbury's (see below).

It was sent from a Gmail address with no links to Sainsburys. It is offering a free "Stanley Quencher Flowstate Tumbler" and all you have to do is click on a link to get the process started. However, this will take you to a website under the control of the criminals where they will seek to steal your personal and financial data
