Experiencing Domestic Abuse

If you are in immediate danger

Call the police on 999

If you cannot speak, press 55 when prompted and listen for instructions. You'll be able to conduct your call in silence.

There are a number of agencies set up to help victim of domestic abuse, many detailed below. Some of these are specifically tailored to certain groups of people either by age, gender or ethnicity. There are also agencies who support the perpetrators to change.
