Macular Society

Nicola's Wish Upon a Star update

236 vulnerable children and young people received a gift at Christmas thanks to Folkestone & Hythe District Council staff, councillors, Kent police and other local organisations including the Channel Rotary Club who took part in 'Nicola's Wish Upon a Star' scheme.

Those who benefit from the scheme range from new-born babies to 18-year-old young adults with hundreds of presents being distributed as part of the 'Wish Upon a Star' appeal.

Partner Updates

Cheriton Baptist Church

Cheriton Baptist Church ran a 'Cheriton celebrates Christmas' event on 18 December 2022.

The day involved a 12 days of Christmas treasure hunt, carols, and Christmas treats and many craft activities.



There were 220 meals served, and an advent Quested gallery that had many local artists exhibit their artwork. The event was free of charge and the day ended with many visitors staying on watching the World Cup football final.

The warm spaces initiative was used throughout the Christmas period with families using the kitchen at the Cheriton Baptist Church to cook and eat over the Christmas holidays.

Urban Pastors

Dave Barker and the Urban Pastors team have been active in the district for 9-years.

The team are out and about every Friday between 7.00pm and 02:00am. Since April 2022, the Urban Pastors have handed out 15 crates of bottled water, 450 cups of soup, 780 hot chocolates and 380 cups of tea and coffee.

The Urban Pastors have been out on the streets totalling 1,890 hours and engaged with over 200 teenagers (with 6 being returned to their parents to keep them away from vulnerable situations).

The Urban Pastors play a key role in keeping the streets of Folkestone and Cheriton safer with the response vehicle and can attend other local areas when called upon.

Last year the Urban Pastor response vehicle headed to Dymchurch where 60 young people aged 13-16 years of age



were congregated drinking alcohol. The Urban Pastors engaged with the group and took away the alcohol and handed out hot chocolate and bottled water whilst waiting for Kent Police to arrive

The team were also on hand in the summer to help locate a missing 6-year-old, thankfully the child was found and reunited with their carer.

They also supported the Cheriton the Folkestone Christmas light switch and the Harbour events that took place during the England World Cup games.

Hestia's Folkestone Haven

Hestia's Folkestone Haven provides mental health support for adults aged 16+ in the Folkestone and Hythe District. The Folkestone Haven is open during the evenings, weekends, and bank holidays, when other support services may be closed.



The aim of the service is to reduce the number of people accessing A&E departments and decrease pressure on other emergency services.

Whether you're struggling with an ongoing mental health condition, bereavement,

work stress, worries about Covid-19, or any other mental health issues. The service is free and there is no need to book an appointment.

Visitors to the Folkestone Haven will be greeted by one of the trained Recovery Workers, who will offer a listening ear and tailored mental health support.

Visitors can also access support groups if they wish, such as art groups and creative writing workshops, to help maintain social inclusion.

The Folkestone Haven is funded by the NHS and a consortium of Kent based Trusts, including the Roger De Haan Charitable Trust.




PCSO surgery for Broadmead and Park, Cheriton and Sandgate Wards

PCSO Brooker will be holding a PCSO surgery for the Broadmead and Park, Cheriton and Sandgate Wards to discuss recent issues and offer crime prevention advice. The surgery will give the public the opportunity to speak with PCSO Brooker in person about any concerns or issues they have.

The surgery will be held at Folkestone Sports Centre Café, Radnor Park Avenue, Folkestone, Kent, CT19 5HX on the 2 February 2023 between 10:00am and 11:00am.

Arrest made during Folkestone traffic checks



During the afternoon of Friday 20 January 2023, a total of 36 vehicles were stopped



during the operation in Cheriton Road, Tram Road and Sandgate Hill.

Kent Police

Seven people were reported for seatbelt offences while others were reported for using a mobile phone at the wheel and speeding. One vehicle was found to be uninsured, resulting in the driving being reported and the car seized.

Officers from Folkestone Community Policing Team, town centre officers and the Kent Special Constabulary also searched two cars for suspected drugs.

An 18-year-old man from Folkestone was arrested in Tram Road on suspicion of drug-driving. He was later released on bail until 20 April pending further enquiries. Two people also received community resolutions for possessing cannabis.

Advice was issued to 23 motorists about a range of issues including vehicle maintenance and responsible driving.

My Community Voice



My Community Voice is a way to be updated by Kent Police about the issues that matter to you.

Unlike social media, My Community Voice is a secure and personal messaging system that allows you to determine what type of messages you receive and how.

To start getting alerts, <u>register your</u> <u>details</u>, tell Community Voice how you would like to be contacted and the topics and issues that matter to you.

The alerts will come to you via email, text or voice note. If you have any information about an appeal, then you can message the team back through

the alert.

Comments and thoughts are welcomed. Clicking on the 'reply' link within a message will send your reply to the person that sent the message and your local policing team

Please note: This service should not be used to report any crime or incident to the police. In an emergency, if a crime is in progress or life is in danger, **call** <u>999</u>.

Fraud / Scams / Thefts



Catalytic Converter Thefts

Catalytic converters are devices fitted to vehicle exhausts to reduce the number of dangerous gases emitted. They are often targeted by thieves as they

contain valuable metals and can be removed in less than a minute.

Catalytic converter theft most frequently occurs in car parks, but they can happen anywhere. Thieves may then sell these converters via scrapyards, online, or ship them out of the country.

Hybrid vehicles are most targeted, as their metals are more valuable, but any vehicle can be at risk of catalytic converter theft.

Signs a catalytic converter theft is being committed

- > a vehicle being raised using a car jack in a car park or residential area
- > a loud drilling or cutting sound coming from underneath the vehicle

Prevent it

Although catalytic converter thefts are increasing, there are steps that you can take to protect your vehicle.

To keep your catalytic converter safe, you can ask your car dealer for advice on locks or guards that are approved by the vehicle manufacturer and tested to Sold Secure Gold.

Alternatively, try to make sure your vehicle is parked in a garage overnight, or if you have a commercial vehicle, park it in a secure compound. If this isn't possible, park in an area that's well-lit and overlooked and try to park so that the converter can't be easily reached by potential thieves. Vehicles that sit high above the road are particularly vulnerable.

You should also register your converter and mark it with a forensic marker, which will make it harder for thieves to dispose of.

Report it

- If the crime is happening now call <u>999</u> if you are unsure, they would rather hear about it and decide if a theft is occurring
- If it is safe to do so, take photos of suspects or the number plate of their car (do not approach suspects, as they have been known to use violence)

If the crime has already happened then you can <u>report it to them online</u> or at your <u>local police station</u>
