Urban Pastors

The Urban Pastors operate mainly in Folkestone and Cheriton, providing community support and playing a key role in keeping the area safe. The team have been active in the district for 15years.

They engage with people who have been out partying or anyone who may find themselves facing difficult situations and sign posting where necessary to other agencies and organisations.





The <u>Urban Pastors — CBC (cheritonbaptist.co.uk)</u> can be seen visiting different spots in Folkestone and in Tontine Street. On the last Friday of each month, the Urban Pastors can be seen under the gazebo outside of Folkestone Town Hall where they are now handing out personal alarms and debit card covers. Later in the evening the pastors can be seen at licensing establishments.

Questionnaires are being handed out to ascertain thoughts on how safe people feel in Folkestone and

engage in positive conversations with people seeking the pastors out in the nighttime economy.

Two of the Urban Pastors can be seen out and about on a Tuesday or a Thursday during the day talking to staff in local businesses and listening to any concerns.

During the past 6 months, our volunteer team has:


Volunteered 410.5 hours across the team

Halloween

On 31 October residents may receive trick or treaters knocking at the doors in the hope of receiving sweets.

If you have young children:

- Never let young children go trick or treating on their own.
- Make sure they only visit people known to your family.



If you have teenagers:

- Make sure they are not going to be using alcohol, flour or eggs. Make it clear that if a 'no trick or treat' sign is displayed, they should leave straightaway.
- ➤ Make sure they do not travel alone and never go into the home of someone they do not know.
- Make sure they understand they must not frighten people. Display the front of this poster in a door or window if you would rather not be visited by Halloween callers.


Below is the latest scam parking fine text message.

It is very similar to the one that I have been alerting recently but is basically a follow up message reminding you to pay the fine or you will be banned from driving and taken to Court.

This is a **SCAM**.

Please do not click on the link within the text message as this will take you to a realistic looking website under the control of the criminals, where they will steal your personal and financial data.





You can report Scam text messages by forwarding to 7726.

If you think that you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your Bank immediately, which you can do by calling 159 and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or call 0300 123 2040.

Violence against women and girls

The Home Office has announced new measures to strengthen the police's response to tackling violence against women and girls in England and Wales. The measures include: a pilot placing domestic abuse specialists in 999 control rooms to advise on risk assessments; and the launch of the new domestic abuse protection order pilot. The measures reinforce the Government's commitment to addressing the root causes of violence, which include supporting schools in teaching children about healthy relationships, respect and consent.

NSPCC Learning has published a Helplines insight briefing on young people's experiences of online sexual extortion, or 'sextortion'. Drawing from contacts to Childline and the NSPCC Helpline in 2023/24, the briefing explores: how sextortion occurs and how it can escalate; the impact on young people's mental wellbeing; how to spot the signs; and how to talk to young people who may be at risk. It also provides guidance for reporting and preventing incidents of sextortion.
