The festive season

Community Safety wants everyone to stay safe during the festive period including New Year's Eve.

Advice when using taxis

All taxis and private hire vehicles are licensed by the council and must display identity plates as detailed below.

Drivers must carry an identification badge on their person or displayed in their vehicle for the passenger to see.

To be licensed, vehicles and drivers complete various regular safety checks to ensure their vehicles are roadworthy and that drivers are responsible. Safe journeys home Know the license plates

Taxis for a day/evening out

Arrange a lift or phone a taxi and request the cab firm to contact you when they arrive. A text message is usually sent to the caller with the taxi drivers cab registration number.

Hailing a taxi

- Hackney carriages or 'black cabs' can be hired from taxi ranks, hailed (flagged down) in the street or pre-booked.
- Taxi vehicles (licensed by Folkestone & Hythe District Council) have an orange and white identification plate with black numbers on the rear and a roof light.

Booking a private hire vehicle

- These are pre-booked through a licensed operator (cannot be flagged down or use taxi ranks)
- Private hire vehicles have a purple and/white identity plate with black numbers on the rear of the vehicle and purple/white side stickers with the council logo.

If you are in any doubt that the vehicle is not a taxi or private hire vehicle do not use it.

Amazon Scams

With the New Year sales on the horizon information for residents to be aware of when shopping online.

Recent reports of Kent victims being targeted with these types of scams.

One victim received a number of calls from criminals impersonating Amazon Fraud dept. They persuaded the victim into opening other accounts. Fortunately, the scam was identified by the intended victims Bank who blocked the accounts.



TO STOP FRAUD

In another incident, the victim received a call from

criminal saying they were from amazon and were asking the victim about their bank account and financial data.

Amazon do not make unsolicited calls to customers. Amazon will never ask you to provide personal information or make a payment outside of their website.

If you think that you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your Bank immediately, which you can do by calling 159 and report it to Action Fraud at <u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u> or call 0300 123 2040.

HMRC SCAM Alert

HMRC is reminding Self-Assessment customers to be alert to potential scams and criminals ahead of the filing deadline on 31 January 2025. Concerned customers reported nearly 150,000 scam referrals to HMRC in the last year, as Self-Assessment filers are warned to be alert to criminals.

With millions of people due to complete their Self-Assessment tax return and pay any tax owed by 31 January 2025, criminals are targeting people with offers of tax refunds or demanding payment of tax to get hold of personal information and

banking details. Around half of all scam reports (71,832) in the last year were fake tax rebate claims.

There has been a 16.7% increase in all scam referrals to HMRC.

If someone receives a communication claiming to be from HMRC that asks for their personal information or is offering a tax rebate, check the advice on <u>Identify tax scam</u> <u>phone calls, emails and text messages - GOV.UK</u> to help identify if it is scam activity.

HMRC will never leave voicemails threatening legal action or arrest or ask for personal or financial information over text message – only fraudsters and criminals will do that.

New Published Reports

Child criminal exploitation

Source: Children, Young People and Education Committee **Date published**: 05 December 2024

The Children, Young People and Education Committee in Wales has published a report into child criminal exploitation and abuse. The report sets out 23 recommendations and focuses on: missing and criminally exploited children; themes relevant to marginalised children; and risk factors for marginalisation. Recommendations for the Welsh Government include: work with local authorities and police forces to take action to ensure that data published relating to children missing from care is accurate and reliable; and work alongside health boards, police forces and other relevant agencies to develop a pan-Wales child criminal exploitation risk assessment tool for use by frontline staff, including in healthcare settings.
