Dear Sir,

I wish to object to the proposed development at Princes Parade, Hythe and to the road closure being sought.

The development is unwanted, unacceptable and will create significant harm, and if the development were to be granted planning permission there is no need to move the road as the proposed buildings could be served from the existing road. It is therefore not necessary for it to be stopped up and realigned for this development to take place.

I ask that the 'stopping up order' is considered by the Secretary of State at the same time as the planning application so that he can see the full picture.

I regularly drive along Prince Parade and wish to continue doing so. Further to this, the local council has just spent a great deal of local people's taxes on installing parking meters against the will of many. The proposed road closure demonstrates a lack of financial planning and a great waste of public money:- If the council knew about wishing to close, and or alter the road, why install meters just before doing so? The parking meters have already had to be moved at great expense only days after being installed.
