Dear Sirs

With respect to the above application the stopping/diversion of the above road is completely inappropriate and unnecessary. Its proposed re-routing beside the Royal Military Canal would obviously seriously affect the Canal - its visual and ecological aspects, together with increased pollution and disturbance to this historic site. Even if the proposed development proceeds on Princes Parade, it is fundamentally not necessary to re-route the road. The proposal is purely to allow the luxury houses of this development uninterrupted access to the beach.

The re routing of the road would create a significant loss for the numerous visitors, tourists and fishermen who use the road to visit PP/beach, as well as it being a convenient alternative route between Hythe and Folkestone. The duplicitous Council have in fact just installed parking meters along the entire length of Princes Parade at considerable cost (having had to relocate them once already) and now seek to close the road. Due to the substantial and significant harm this application would cause, it should be refused.
