Dear Sirs,

I wish to object to this proposal to relocate Princes Parade, in Hythe Kent for the following reasons:

The position of the relocated road will have a very significant detrimental impact of the Royal Military Canal which is a Scheduled Monument;

The proposed leisure centre and housing development has not received planning permission, the relocation of the road will put undue pressure on the Community to accept the development;

The road is historic and has been in place for many years without the need for relocation;

Relocation of the existing road is not required, the potential new development can be accessed from the existing Princes Parade with potentially a shared space scheme which would improve the streetscape and calm traffic speeds;

The "vehicle free link from the proposed leisure centre and housing development to the beach and existing promenade" highlighted by the application will be at the detriment of the walkers, runners, cyclists, anglers, rowers, visitors and local people who use the canal path every day and enjoy its peaceful, tranquil and traffic free setting.
