With reference to the above case number I am writing to object to the stopping up of Princess Parade.

As a local resident the stopping up of the road will impact upon me, I use the road to park along when I meet friends twice a week to run. I enjoy driving along the road on nice evenings, parking up and enjoying the scenery, I see no reason why this should be taken away from me, the seafront is there for the community to enjoy, I am concerned about the costs involved in stopping up the road, a project that will incur costs, but produce nothing financial in return.

The canal and surrounding area will be disrupted by building work whilst the road is stopped up. I am concerned that the stopping up will force more traffic into the main A249, which is already busy and has many parked cars either side.

I can see absolutely no benefit to the stopping up of princess parade, a road I have enjoyed using for over 40 years. I urge you not to take this facility away from local residents.
