I send this email as an objection to the stopping up of the road namely Princess Parade in Hythe Kent CT21

1. I can see no benefit to stopping up this road, the new development if allowed to go ahead can be easily accessed via Princess Parade
2. The proposed re siting of the road would cause considerable traffic build up on an already very busy road namely Seabrook Road the A259
3. I believe it would also badly affect The Royal Military Canal which is an English heritage site which I believe the proposed plan to re site the road goes against their recommendation
4. It would adversely affect the wildlife along the canal and destroy the peaceful setting
5. The existing Road has been there for very many years and is used by many including local fisherman who have many fishing competitions on the sea front, by the many who come and park to just enjoy the sea front and then if raining just sit in their cars to enjoy their lunch and the peace of the sea view, the elderly and disabled who cannot walk the distance also come and park on this road to enjoy the promenade and the vista
6. The Canal path is enjoyed by many who walk their dogs, by fisherman who fish in the Canal, by cyclists and runners and children who all enjoy the peace of the Canal setting which would be destroyed if the road was re sited near the Canal
7. We already enjoy a wide promenade along this piece of road
8. I have lived here by the entrance to Marine Parade for 14 years and have walked along the prom probably hundreds of times and have never seen speeding traffic or a congested promenade nor have I seen any vehicle accidents but have witnessed accidents on the Seabrook Road the A259 which would become even more dangerous
